
ACCOMPLISHMENTS

I-Promise Graduates



In 2013, a total of 114 I-Promise students who entered in 2009 graduated with a BA, BS, or BFA degree. Combined with other cohorts of I-Promise graduates, there are now 779 alumni.

The chart to the left shows the percentage of I-Promise students in different cohorts (2005 to 2009) who graduated. Slightly more than half of I-Promise students graduate in four years, with 73 to 82 percent graduating within five years. For those cohorts where six-year graduation data are available, an additional three percent of students graduate.

First-Generation Coca-Cola Scholars

Through the generosity of the Coca-Cola Foundation, six freshman I-Promise students were selected as First-Generation Coca-Cola Scholars this academic year. To be chosen, the students had to meet additional criteria, which included being first in their families to attend college and meeting certain academic standards. These six students are the first of four cohorts who will benefit from the financial support of Coca-Cola during their four years in college. In addition to the benefits available to all I-Promise students, firstgeneration Coca-Cola scholars are matched with academic or community mentors, receive academic monitoring, and participate in targeted community-building activities.

MENTORING

The purpose of the mentoring program is to help ease the transition to college for freshmen and transfer students. During this academic year, 101 students were matched with mentors, with two-thirds of the students voluntarily choosing adult mentors and one-third choosing peer mentors. Orientation training, ongoing support, opportunities

to develop skills, and communitybuilding events are features of the I-Promise mentoring program. Mentors make a one-year commitment to serve in this role, but several mentors and students continue their connection year after year (like Marjorie Mizes and Bianca Flowers below).

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Illinois Promise is an access scholarship program initiated in 2005 to provide high-achieving, low-income students an opportunity to attend the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Educational expenses, including tuition, fees, room and board, and books and supplies are covered. In addition, enrichment programs are offered to foster student success.

Students do not apply to become an

I-Promise scholar. Rather, students gain admittance to the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The Office of Student Financial Aid then determines eligibility based on the following criteria:

- Illinois residency
- Under the age of 24 and admitted as a freshman or transfer student
- Family income at or below the federal poverty level (\$23,050 for a family of four)
- Family assets of less than \$50,000 (does not include the home)

- The Expected Family Contribution (EFC) equal to \$0 • Minimum enrollment of 12 credit hours
- during fall and spring semesters

Funding the program takes a team approach. I-Promise students receive federal, state, institutional and/or private grants and scholarships for which they qualify. The I-Promise award is based on the difference between the student's cost of attendance and

other financial aid received. I-Promise funding is provided from institutional resources as well as private funding from individuals and corporate donors. In the 2012-2013 academic year, I-Promise funding totaled \$5,316,590; the average award per student was \$6,869.




I-Promise Student Profile, Academic Year 2012-2013

Enrollment of I-Promise Students by College, Academic Year 2012-2013






